Section II: Comprehensive Review Update

The DD Council Standing Committees will continue to focus their efforts to improve the quality of life of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. The Children and Family Issues Committee focused its efforts on critical public policy, advocacy, capacity building, and systemic change activities that affect the lives of children with developmental disabilities and their families. In the area of education. The Tri-Agency on Developmental Disabilities comprised of the DD Council, University of Guam Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities in Education, Research, and Service (CEDDERS), Guam Legal Services-Disability Law Center (GLSC-DLC) continue to work together to build capacity, systems change, and advocacy to the Guam Community. Continued partnership with with the Guam Department of Education, Division of Special Education (DOE SPED) resulted to six (4) workshops in Transitions throughout the island to educate parents in the opportunities and impacts of Life after High School.

The Adults Issues Committee concentrated its efforts on critical public policy, advocacy and systemic change activities that affect the lives of adults with developmental disabilities and their families. In the area of employment, continuous collaboration with the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), Division of Vocational Rehabilitation(DVR), and the Department of Labor (DOL) to identify and refer individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities for orientation and assessment for opportunities in employment and or post-secondary opportunities. The Council actively participates in the annual National Employment Disability Awareness Month in October and continues to advocate for the implementation of Public Law 26-109, relative to the hiring of individuals with severe disabilities as certified by the DVR. In the area of housing, continues its partnership with Guam Housing Urban Renewal Authority (GHURA) for the Section 8 Mainstream Housing Program design to provide vouchers to enable persons with disabilities (elderly or non-elderly) to rent affordable private housing of their choice. Currently, vouchers are limited and the Council has been advocating for additional vouchers to service individuals with disabilities who are on the waiting list.

The Cross Cutting Issues Committee continues to focus its efforts on critical public policy, advocacy, capacity building and systemic change activities that affect cross-cutting issues activities. In the area of Self-advocacy, the Council supports numerous opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities who are considered leaders to provide leadership training to individuals with developmental and other disabilities and assuming leadership roles in the community.

Economic:

A year ago, there were signs of economic growth, but subsequent developments have dampened some of the optimism and general doubts about both short and long-term prospects for two of the island's main economic drivers, tourism and the military buildup. Following the March 2011 earthquake and tsunami in Japan, Guam's tourism was down 4.8 percent between January and September 2011. The economic impact of the buildup also remains unclear, with the terms, size and timing of the military buildup on Guam. Under the new leadership of Governor Edward Calvo and Lt. Governor Raymond Tenorio, the administration is committed to changing the government, foster economic growth, eliminate the debt, decrease poverty, and build the Guamanian dream. The administration recognizes major issues affecting Guam and the cycle of poverty that threatens the community's future. The administration's objective is to improve the Guamanian lives by breaking down barriers, bringing vision to everyday decisions and making government transparent, responsive, caring and restrained. Annual Progress Report:

The DD Council continue to face challenges with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (DMHSA) currently under a Permanent Injunction to provide Direct Support services and case management services to individuals with intellectual disabilities. The program mandate focuses on DMHSA clients as the agency's priority. The DD Council will continue advocating for inclusion of individuals with development disabilities to be served.

The DD Council has been monitoring and pursuing the Individualized Budgeting Program (IBP) with the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) to ensure funding is provided to assist individuals with disabilities to direct and manage the delivery of services she or he requires and is authorized to receive. Through Council efforts, funding will be provided by the Department of Interior/Compact Impact funds with program implementation to commence FY 2013.

Annual Progress Report:

The DD Council collaborates with agency partners in supporting and building connections in the community. In partnership with the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) and the Department of Integrated Services for Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), a grant for \$1.3 million was awarded to GRTA. About \$1 million of the grant will go towards the construction of a new DISID Resource Center. The remaining \$300,000 is allocated for the creation of a One Call-Once Click Center. The project implementation is schedule to commence in FY 2013.

The DD Council is an active member of the Aging Disability Resource Center (ADRC) Committee overseeing the Guam Get Care System. The Guam GetCare is an online directory and care coordination tool connecting the people of Guam to long-term care services and resources. Guam GetCare offers a territory-wide service directory to help individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families to get quick and easy access to services.

The DD Council sponsors conferences and workshops consisting of breakout sessions encouraging active participation and building self confidence and social skills among the groups. The self advocacy workshop has increased its capacity among friends known as the “Super Friends” with over one hundred in their circle of friends.

About 184 participants: 52 adults with disabilities, 14 family members, 79 service providers, and 39 general public.

The Tri-Agency consisting of the DD Council, Guam Legal Services Corporation-Disability Law Center (GLSC-DLC), and the Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research and Service (CEDDERS) along with the Department of Education, Division of Special Education (DOE-SPED) conducted four (4) workshops on “Transitions – “Life After High School” to students and families on educational supports, services, legal programs, to include a presentation on self advocacy and self determination. Over 100 participated in the workshop with positive feedback and recommendations from the participants. Additionally, the Tri-Agency collaborated with DOE-SPED conference for parents of children receiving special education services.

The DD Council anticipates the publication of a ‘Student and Parent Guide for Transition Planning” to be completed by 2014.

Annual Progress Report:

The DD Council is a collaborative partner with the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Program (DVR) and the One Stop Career Center (OSCC), Department of Labor (DOL). The DD Council informs individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities about employment opportunities DISID/DVR offers. The DD Council identifies and provides referrals to DISID/DVR for further assessment on program eligibility. OSCC/DOL provides information on job availability on a monthly basis and information is shared with Council members.

The DD Council provided information during the Four (4) sponsored workshop on "Transitions: Life After High School" with emphasis on self advocacy about DISID/DVR programs and services. Additionally, outreach is provided to high schools students with intellectual and developmental disabilities and encourages participation in the orientation and assessment process to determine eligibility. The DD Council will advocate for systems change on DVR program eligibility requirements from their grantor to allow and increase participation in the program.

Council roles and responsibilities in collaboration:

The DD Act mandates the Councils to establish, strengthen, support, and expand a state self- advocacy organization. The DD Council has taken action on this journey for a state self-advocacy organization for Guam with Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr., 32nd Guam Legislature. Anticipated completion is March 2013.

Problems encountered as a result of collaboration:

The Council educated the policy advisors and makers on the DD Act requirements and provided copies of the act. Extensive documents on training/conferences/summit activities and accomplishments were provided to support the Self Advocates in Action (SiñA) organization to be the state self advocacy organization for Guam.

Senator Rodriguez is required to have a Public Hearing for the resolution due to Substantive Changes affecting the Guam Community. After successful completion of the Public Hearing with testimonies, and Executive Order will be prepared for the Governor of Guam to approve.

Unexpected benefits:

Immediately following the Resolution, the Executive Order will be prepared for approval by the Governor of Guam.

Issue 2: Increase Employment Opportunities

Description of collaborative issue/barrier or expected outcome:

The Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID), Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR, must collaborate with their grantor to amend or adjust program eligibility requirements to allow for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to be eligible for the program.

Life Areas:

- Self-Determination Health Transportation Recreation
- Employment Education Childcare Housing
- Community Inclusion Quality Assurance

Council roles and responsibilities in collaboration:

To advocate for individuals with developmental disabilities to have opportunities to be informed and obtain employment in the community.

Coordinate and collaborate with the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) and Department of Labor (DOL), to identify and refer adults with developmental disabilities for educational/vocational opportunities and services through the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR).

Coordinate and collaborate with DISID/DVR and Guam Department of Education (GDOE), Division of Special Education (SPED), to provide information on training and employment opportunities for students exiting high school.

Problems encountered as a result of collaboration:

Many individuals with disabilities are often frustrated and discouraged with the DVR program regulations and eligibility requirements.

Unexpected benefits:

Collaborate with the Tri-Agency partners to conduct training to drivers to be sensitive to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Also, to improve the policies and procedures of paratransit services as a systems change initiative.

Council roles and responsibilities in collaboration:

Advocate and systems change activities to improve and expand Paratransit services in the community.
